8* MOTION- ENHANCEMENT OF SECURITY IN THE COUNTY

Honorable Speaker, I beg to move the following motion;

THAT, aware that pursuant to Article 29 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, every person has the right to freedom and security; **Further aware that** cattle rustling/banditry is a major menace and security threat in the County; **Concerned that** the menace has since left irreparable and negative socioeconomic impact which include but are not limited to increased number of widows, widowers, orphaned children, poverty, displacement of people leading to Internally Displaced Persons (IDPS), disruption of educational health programs and other economic activities owing to the destruction and/or closure of educational, health and other institutions; **Further Concerned that** the people living in the affected regions have been denied the enjoyment of their social, economic and political rights as guaranteed to them under the Bill of Rights as enshrined in Chapter Four of the Constitution; this House **urges** the County Government to liaise with the Ministry of Interior and National Administration to Establish a County Task force on cattle rustling/banditry to:

- i. Investigate the causes of the rampant cattle rustling and banditry in the County;
- ii. Establishes the extent of suffering, loss and damage the cattle rustling/banditry has occasioned to the communities;
- iii. Establish a means in compensating all victims of cattle rustling/banditry occasioned by the menace;

2. NOTICES OF MOTIONS

- a. **Notice of Motion- REPAIR OF ALL DAMAGED ROADS OCCASSIONED BY EL-NINO RAINS**

That, Aware that Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, stipulates that County transport, including county roads is a function of the County Government; **Noting that** the Country has been experiencing enhanced rains since April, 2024 with alarming levels of rainfall because of El Nino conditions; **Concerned that** El Niño rains can have had significant impacts on roads and infrastructure in the County; **Further Concerned that** the heavy rainfall has led to erosion, flooding, damaging roads, bridges and other infrastructure which has resulted to road closures, travel disruptions and increased maintenance costs for repairs; this House **urges** the County government to assess the extent of the damage occasioned by the floods, to determine the scope of the repairs needed and prioritize repairs based on the severity of the damage and the importance of the road in the transportation network.
